GUC Library has scored another first by installing the much coveted Explorer DSTV system to beef up its array of audiovisual services. The system is the latest in the market and most likely the only one around Garissa region and comes with numerous benefits.

First and foremost, coming with a 75 inch flat TV screen means that users will no longer strain their eyes, scramble or clutter at the forefront to view or listen to programmes. The TV screen is also one of the latest in the market with razor sharp images and surround and stereo sound outputs. It allows connectivity by both the traditional video and also HDMI cable which is much clearer

The Explorer decoder has numerous capabilities including the possibility of sharing the same dish with other decoders on different channels. The decoder can also accommodate audio and video files from other devices such as memory

GUC Library Conducts A Massive Acquisition of Books

n commemoration of the 2016 International Open Access Week whose theme was "Open in Action", the library mounted a booksourcing exhibition which was held at the Main Campus on 26th October 2016 from 8:00am to 5:00pm.

The aim of this exercise was to provide an opportunity to GUC staff and students to participate in selection of books for acquisition by the library. It also provided a good opportunity for those who wished to buy their own university class textbook materials directly from the exhibitors who comprised renowned booksellers in the country. These included Jimco Book Services, Njigua Books, KerKem Agencies, Falcon Books Ltd and Gabby Books Ltd. However and contrary to expectations, Moi University Bookshop could not attend due to other engagements.

During the exercise, the library managed to link a number of students particularly those taking information related courses with some suppliers to assist in the coordination of the exhibition on contract basis. This was a golden opportunity for them not only to earn some pocket money but also to learn the art and science of booktrade which is part and parcel of information science.

About 700 titles and 2,000

of the library acquiring high end ICT equipment to enhance virtual library services. The equipment involumes of books were selected for acquisition and are already undergoing processing to make them shelf ready.

Commenting on the exercise, both students and staff agreed that this was the a novel and best way to acquire library materials in the sense that it made it possible to scrutinize the content of the books hence lead to very relevant collection.


The library has also acquired a heavy duty network enabled duplex A3 printer with additional capacity to scan and photocopy for reprographic services.



The recently acquired An LCD projector will also help the library play a bigger role in teaching, user education and capacity


How to Access Electronic Books and Journals
